1. Introduction

- 1.1. The City of Portsmouth College is a Further Education College established under the Further and Higher Education Act 1992 and is an exempt charities for the purposes of the Charities Act 2011.
- 1.2. For more than 55 years we've been at the heart of the community and beyond. 3. Our Commitment

- 3.1. We are committed to ensuring that slavery and human trafficking have no place in our business or our supply chain.
- 3.2. This statement has been approved by the College Leadership Team and the College's Governing Body. It will be reviewed annually.
- 3.3. This statement is made pursuant to Section 54 part 6 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our College's slavery and human trafficking statement for the academic year ending 31 July 2022.
